Crichton Blyia, daughter of
Col. David Crichton
died (aged 97) 28 June
1930

of Sir George Brichton, admiral
of Scotland, and a kinsman
of Chancellor Brichton; and
in November a general council
held at Sterling "put to
the horn" the whole Brichton
Kin, and removed the
head of the family from the
Office of Chancellor.

But the ex-Chancellor
was still master of Edinburgh
castle, and from this strong
hold was able to withstand
on the Douglases by harrying
the lands of their friends.

At length in 1445,
after a siege of nine weeks
Brichton was forced to
capitulate, but on terms
which prove that his
enemies recognized his

importance in the country.
All his past offences were
remitted, and he himself was
again received into the
service of the King
(vol 1 p. 226)

Chancellor William Bouchier
and his brother the admiral
Sir George Bouchier died
in 1454.

Brighton (collegiate church)
in Middletham, eight miles
south from Edinburgh, founded
26 December 1449 by Sir William
Brighton Chancellor of Scotland
with consent of James Brighton
of Fren draught, Knight, his
son and heir
(Keiths Bishop of Scotland
1824)

Alexander Brodie married
Gryzel Brighton (sister of
Admiral Brighton) a
daughter of Robert Brighton
of ~~Edinburgh~~ and ~~Bluney~~ ^{Dumfries}, admiral
to Queen Mary. ^{By Elizabeth}
Stewart, sister to Lord Downie
(Brakes Genealogy
vol 3 p. 395)

James Brighton (Admiral)
educated at ^{St Andrews}
under George Buchanan
in ^{Horreum Rubrum}
Salvator College

James Crichton, son of Robert
Crichton, Lord Advocate of
Scotland; and was descended
by his mother, a Stuart, from
King Robert II

Sir Robert Crichton (1st Lord Crichton
of Sanquhar) died 1502
Marquis of Szute family descended
from him.
